The Heart of a Christian Leader

Principles of Christian Leadership:

- 1. **Leadership as Service:** In the world, leadership is often seen as a position of power. However, in the Kingdom of God, leadership is synonymous with service. Jesus taught us this when He said, "But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:26-28, ESV). As Christian men, we are called to lead by example, serving others with humility and grace.
- 2. **The Importance of Integrity:** A true leader in Christ embodies integrity. Proverbs 11:3 tells us, "The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity." Our actions and decisions must align with God's Word, demonstrating honesty and righteousness. It's through integrity that we build trust and influence others positively.
- 3. **Leading with Love and Compassion:** The foundation of Christian leadership is love. 1 Corinthians 16:14 exhorts us, "Let all that you do be done in love." This love is not passive but active—reaching out to others, showing compassion, and standing firm in truth. A leader's love should be evident in every interaction, whether it's comforting the brokenhearted or encouraging the weary.
- 4. **The Role of Faith and Prayer:** A Christian leader must be a man of faith and prayer.
